2. Public Comment

Chair North called for public comment. There was none, public comment was closed.

3. Approval of Minutes - November 5, 2021

Council Member Chisel made a motion to approve the minutes as presented. Council Member McCormick seconded the motion. The motion was APPROVED by a vote of 11-0-2.

4. Discussion and Possible Action to Approve Revised Meeting Schedule

Council Member McCormick made a motion to approve the revised meeting schedule as presented. Council Member Greco seconded the motion. The motion was APPROVED by a vote of 11-0-2.

Vice Chair McCormick asked if the IAC would be meeting face to face format going forward. Dr. Hilgersom answer said it was on her list to discuss with Chair North on whether or not to continue to meet on Zoom three times a year, and then face to face two times a year. This item will be added to the agenda for the May meeting.

5. Chair's Update Including, but Not Limited to:

a) Introduction of New Members

Chair North introduced new Council Members Jennifer Kenney, Director of Learning and Development, Grand Sierra Resort and Milton Stewart, CEO, Nevadaworks. President Hilgersom announced that Washoe County Manager Eric Brown had been appointed the the TMCC IAC as well, but would not be joining this meeting due to a scheduling conflict.

b) IAC Chairs Meeting

Chair North attended a meeting with Vice Chancellor Abba and the other IAC Chairs. It was a very productive meeting in which one of the charges was to clarify the work of the IAC and what it does. The role of the IAC has always been a little unclear and undefined since its inception, and intentionally so. The Chairs are engaging in discussions to create a new document to refine the charge of the IACs to better advocate and assist the community colleges.

6. President's Update

a) Spring Semester Opening Update

Dr. Hilgersom was happy to report that activities at TMCC were going extremely well. Students are on campus, parking lots are full, students, faculty and staff were still abiding by safety protocols even though the mask mandate had been lifted by Governor Sisolak. Enrollment was down by 3% in Full-Time Equivalency (FTE), but that was welcome considering how community colleges across the nation were being impacted by the pandemic. She was hopeful that the Fall semester would see the return of enrollment back to pre-pandemic levels.

b) Legislative Budget and Planning

The Nevada System of Higher Education (NSHE) had been meeting with the individual institutions to discuss budget requests and capital plans for the next biennium. The collective findings will be presented at the Board of Regents meeting on March 3-4, 2022 at Nevada State College. President Hilgersom was working with the AB450 Committee, more information would follow in a separate agenda item. Dr. Hilgersom shared that TMCC was actively pursuing funding to move forward with the EastView capital project. A joint letter from TMCC and the University of Nevada, Reno would be going to legislators in support of EastView and the Nevada State Public Health Laboratory at the UNR.

Chair North asked for some key talking points to help IAC Members have a better understanding of the project and to better support/advocate for it within the community and their respective business sectors. She asked how much TMCC was looking to raise for the EastView project. TMCC was looking to raise than \$5M from donors to contribute to the \$50M project. Dr. Hilgersom said at the last meeting, she asked if the IAC if would be willing to send a letter to the Governor's office in support of the project. There was consensus to do so, thus a letter was submitted on behalf of the IAC. There may be more opportunities for support as the college proceeds with the project. **STOP**

c) Nevada Promise Program

President Hilgersom background on program 427 scholars, 190 mentors, estimate to capture 400 high school seniors this year. 88 new mentors, could benefit from more mentors. Dr. Hilgersom I have three mentees. If you are willing to take on.

Vice Chair McCormick have had two mentees, one current. Completing a four year degree at TMCC. Great spending time with him to talk about goals and objectives and help connect him to people in the business sector. Good way to reach possible future employees. TMCC does a great job supporting the mentors. It's a mandated piece of the scholarship program.

7. Updates

a) Vice Chancellor of Community Colleges Update

Vice Chancellor Crystal Abba highlighted four items co-req compliance, IAC proposal working on, issue of free community college being expanded.

IAC proposal – desire on the part of the IAC Chairs to revise the provisions that govern the IACs and how they are intended to operate. The current charge is incredibly broad. Several of the IACs have struggled with how they support their presidents. Made up of community do'ers. New proposal put the president in the driver seat of how they utilize that support. The President will be able to establish the IAC in the way they see best. Provide what the president needs most at that particular point and time. Is flexible, and can adjust to the college and president's needs. This is about flipping the dialogue, instead of President supporting IAC, President will decide how the IAC can support the college. Because there was a perception among legislature that IACs were doing the work of workforce advisory boards. Clarify the procedure and process for the legislators and community. Presented at June BOR, have requested that IAC Chairs draft a letter of support. Due April 22.

SB128 study, required treasurer's office to do a study of the Silver State, Guinn, and Nevada Promise. Report and recommendations completed April 1. Guinn Center has hired to do that study, have had a conversation with the education committee, getting an extension, see final report this summer. Looking at Student outcomes, ROI of the programs, how they are administered, the Millenium Scholarship, SSOG NSHE oversees formula, Nevada Promise high school seniors. All very different and address different need.

<u>Governor's address, Page 11</u> – HS education is not enough, pre-school through Community College or other Workforce Training programs. Do not know if the intent is expand the Promise program or have another mechanism. AB450 committee meeting, requesting a member of the Governor's Staff attend to expand on that comment. "free" makes me nervous. Do want to make sure there is appropriate funding that targets programs or students that need it the most.

Co-req implementation. Institutions have fully implemented co-req. All comm colleges are in full compliance. Data is looking good.

Chair North – who will be involved in the workforce discussion with the Governor, makes me nervous, conversation about changing structure, have grave concerns about that. Hope there will be a voice for the community colleges to stay autonomous and not an extension of K-12. VC Abba agree wholeheartedly, modeled after legislation that occurred in 2013, in that study, looked at Nevada structure and see where community colleges are in the structure in Nevada. What it was trying to answer, stated that our system is the envy of the country. Seamless transition, more opportunities, leave as is.

President Hilgersom – funding formula however is an issue, need ways to fund workforce, can't always subsidize with liberal arts.

Chair North would be able to look at **SEND OUT TO MEMBERS** this is information that is beneficial to help the Members carry the message of the college while in the community. Nevada Legislature Bulletin No. 15-4.
