This 65-credit program provides training and practice (practicum) for teachers, assistant teachers, directors, and owners of child care centers and preschools. Students enter the program with varying degrees of experience. The program will provide students with a well-rounded background in the field of Early Childhood Education. Some students may enroll at the college based written articulated occupational program agreements with designated school districts. Upon completion of an articulated high school course, with documented validation of mastery of competencies and a grade of "B" or better, students become eligible to receive college credit and a letter grade for the articulated course at TMCC. DISCUSSION: do other AAS degrees hold the same terminology? Students should have choices for that which is most appropriate for their education.	Passed with one abstention. 02-09-01	AAS and Certificate of Achievement in Culinary Art: Changes to current AAS and Certificate (Full Semesters) – Cannan. Approved with the stipulation that "required" be exchanged for "recommended" in the general education human relations requirements. DISCUSSION: The accreditation body does not want his nor does the requestor of this change. Management 212 is the accepted course by the accreditation body: this could pose jeopardy for this newly accredited program. AMEND: Motion to delete language stipulating the "required" be replaced by "preferred" or "recommended". DISCUSSION: Karen Cannan did NOT want this change and only wanted the semester portion changes. This decision to add language is rash and could put the accreditation in jeopardy.
