4. 12% Budget Cuts

- Julia reported the NSHE Budget Reduction Task Force & TMCC are looking at every possible way to cut.
- There are minimal planned Classified layoffs; possibly two or three. Classified layoffs may not be necessary as there were quite a few buyouts submitted which have a good chance of being approved.

5. Distinguished Retired Classified Grant-in-Aid

- This has been approved by the President. We are working on getting the language approved by HR to update the Classified Council Webpage.

6. Student Services Division Low Staffing Model

- This topic was actually discussed later on during the meeting due to wanting to allow time for other agenda items to be discussed and also to allow Classified employees to be heard.
- Council President, Julia Bledsoe, started this discussion by apologizing to all affected by the Low Staffing Model implemented this year. There were many who did not understand how important it was. Julia followed up with discussions with President Hilgersom, the Ombudsman, and EMRB. She also shared how much it affected the integrity of the Classified Council Board itself.
- Julia was thanked by many Classified employees for taking this so seriously.
- Several Classified employees shared their feelings and how it affected them. So important for people in higher authority to understand that it is not just two people who said something or who were greatly affected by this decision to enforce the Low Staffing Model solely to the Student Services Division.
- Natalie Brown offered support and asked what the best way to move forward is.
- Julia called on Andy Hughes, Director of Admissions & Records. Andy did not respond. He may not have been available.
