There was concern from a reviewer where it was noted learning measures to include a rubric, but is not a requirement. Chair Irintchevia asked the committee whether they want to require including rubrics in the learning measures. The committee noted this would not work for every course and it varies by discipline and style. It was also noted: the departments have their standards established, there are different approaches in teaching, and tests, quizzes and homework assess outcomes. It was ultimately agreed this is not a task for this committee at this time.

## **Other Business**

- 1. GE Workflow Update: Julia Bledsoe reported GE courses will automatically go to the GE review team.
- 2. Courses and Programs reviewed in their entirety every time: The committee agreed yes, the review is useful to uncover any transfer issues and correct any prerequisite issues. The cons were the burden on faculty and the time it will take to get the review correct. Chair Irintcheva noted as a committee we currently have no way to enforce a review or know it happened. It was

also suggested to link the old MCO data on the webpage. It was decided to have anyone wishing to access the old data to contact Julia and create a notation on the website.

- 3. Gen Ed task force: A joint taskforce is forming with the Academic Standards and Assessment Committee and are seeking representatives who teach Gen Ed course. The taskforce will finalize how quickly they want to change the Gen Ed requirements. The taskforce will evaluate the criteria and also how it fits and will provide a text box for the submitter to demonstrate this. Virginia will send out an announcement to gather members and form the taskforce completely.
- 4. CRC Review Cycle: It was discussed to create a CRC review cycle to review courses in CIM in as similar manner as PUR, but one year prior to the PUR. The discussion circled around who would enforce this. Suggestions received were to have the Deans and Chairs discuss this and to create a proposal to get buy in. Virginia will start a Google doc to begin a proposal draft.
