Discussion: Mentioned credit change to allow for transfer from GBC. Question about students finding 0.5 credit courses was answered with in the technical sciences there are several.

Informational Items:

ENG 113/114: Changes were made to the names of the courses in Common Course Numbering to include "and Multilingual" so the new course names are "Composition I for International and Multilingual Students" and "Composition II for International and Multilingual Students."

The RN to BSN program had some minor changes made including the inclusion of a recommendation of MATH 126 for the math requirement and the renumbering of the semesters in the course sequence to begin with the 5th semester.

Melissa Deadmond presented some updates coming from NSHE:

- NSHE is no longer allowing 300 400 level courses in the first 2 years of program sequences for programs eligible for transfer between institutions without system approval. Possible audits of transfer agreements will be coming. Programs for which TMCC is already teaching the 300-level course will probably not have any changes.
- For new programs, NSHE is requiring documentation that you have consulted faculty at other institutions.
- New programs (Associates and higher) are required to be in the annual planning report for NSHE. Certificates and Skills do not have to be in the planning report. This means any new programs have to be approved by the CRC in early November to make the deadline. The only Associates and higher programs which may be exempt from being in the planning report are those which are specifically requested by industry outside of the normal timeline.
- NSC is reducing the residency requirement from 32 credits to 30 credits. All other institutions currently have 32 credits, but may follow this in the future.
