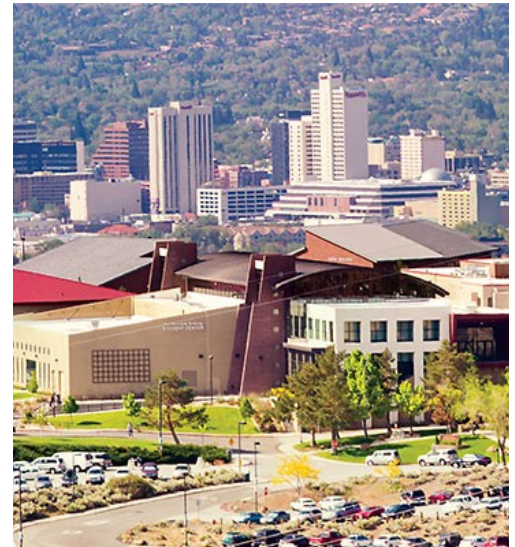


INTERNSHIP OPPORTUNITIES
